Sheboygan Student Success Center & Writing Center

The combined Student Success Center (SSC) and Writing Center at UW-Green Bay, Sheboygan Campus, provides free tutoring to help students discover their strengths and reach their potential.

Staff and scheduling

Peer tutors have excelled in their classes and are ready to help students on a drop-in or by-appointment basis. In the fall 2019 semester, not only were peer tutors recommended by subject-area faculty members, but much of the SSC drop-in tutoring schedule was set based on polls conducted by those faculty members. Tutoring was scheduled as much as possible to fit within the class schedules of the students most likely to seek the help of peer tutors.

The Writing Center within the SSC is staffed by an English Department instructor. In addition to her scheduled hours for tutoring, the English instructor's office is located within the SSC, and she is often available to answer student questions as they arise (for example, file formatting issues, research tactics, thesis statement revisions, MLA, APA, and Chicago Manual of Style clarifications, and more).

Facility

The Student Success Center & Writing Center is centrally located on the Sheboygan campus, just steps from the Commons and food services. Students often bring their lunch to tutoring sessions.

The SSC, room 3108, offers space for students and tutors to meet individually or in groups. The center also offers access to whiteboards, computers, a printer/scanner, and some basic office equipment, such as staplers, three-hole punches, paper cutters, etc.

Hours

The SSC offers students access to computers when other campus facilities (such as the library) may be closed. While classes are in session the SSC is open as follows:

- Monday-Thursday: 8 a.m.-7 p.m.
- Friday: 8 a.m.-4 p.m.

Subject areas covered in fall 2019

During the fall 2019 semester, appointments and drop-in tutoring were available one-on-one and for groups in the following subjects:

- Algebra
- Biology
- Chemistry
- Writing

In addition, a peer tutor worked within the math computer labs while Hawkes classes were in session. Tutors also helped with physics/astronomy courses and advanced math courses.

Students who needed tutoring beyond what was offered in the SSC were referred to the main campus Learning Center in Green Bay or Brainfuse, online tutoring

Data from fall 2019

In fall 2019, tutors completed a "Tutoring Record" form after each tutoring session. The following table (Table 1) is based on information provided in those self-reports. It should be noted that while working to provide as accurate a picture as possible about the services provided within the Student Success Center & Writing Center in fall 2019, some discrepancies in the data may be attributed to incomplete self-reports, missing records, or data entry errors.

Other data collected

The collection of tutoring records started in fall 2018, but the information collected was sporadic and incomplete (especially in fall 2018) and did not provide much in the way of useful results. However, the following tables do provide some insights into peak usage based on tutoring session start times (Table 2) and tutoring session durations (Table 3) that may be useful in setting up future schedules.

Hello Jared,

Thank you for your reply and giving the insights as to services at Manitowoc.

Would you have some similar data on the last academic year, or at least prior semester?

One note to clarify would be the 5th bullet point in the **Some Notes** section---this point must have been misinterpreted but they do not have to have a work study award to work as a tutor. It has been a good practice to put out a feeler to the instructors in the current semester to ask for their recommendations for hires in the next regardless of the financial aid picture.

As for Brainfuse usage, the students have an option to provide feedback after each session. If you have particular names, we could ask for their feedback to help with assessing the resource. We have asked the vendor to add a registration field to include a student's home campus.

Let me know the numbers again at semester end. I'll be sharing this with my meetings with Clif.

Our numbers are not a true reflection for the following reasons:

- Our Tutors didn't start until early October due to snags in the paperwork and processing of hiring.
- Not having any English/Writing Student Tutors (Which have always been the majority of our tutoring numbers as
 evident by the majority of tutoring this semester being of English/Writing even with only 3 hrs/wk. This could
 also have played a role in why there was limited interest in tutoring this semester as I was only able to find 2
 Tutors thus far.)
- We've also found the course schedule this year difficult to work around as there is not as many break times between classes and much more overlap in subjects causing a fair amount of students to not be able to meet with our tutors at any time between 9am-3pm.
- Student awareness and interest of our tutoring services has also dipped in my opinion due to the previous 2 semesters (when our budget was cut in half weeks before starting the school year).
- It has also been impossible to search out tutors via their work study eligibility due to our students not receiving sufficient communication or opportunity to apply for work study before those at the home campus did (as the money was put in one pot and home campus students register sooner) putting our students on the work study wait list with no ETA. I was also not able to get a list of all work study students like we always have in previous years. All of this drastically affects hiring and number of hours of tutoring we can offer. Even though we had our budget restored from last year, we are only able to hire about the same limited hours due to this work study issue.

As far as Brainfuse:

We have had several students report to us that they find Brainfuse difficult to use and not personal enough to be able to help them with their particular classes. For writing, preferring a physical person to sit down with. For Math, preferring someone who knows the course experientially/knows the instructor's expectations.
