 a. Zea: I like that he emphasized students of all majors can be in SGA. All opinions matter.

b. Lucas: Important to help students get registered to vote, and his help could be quite essential.

b) Parliamentary Procedure Presentation - Riley Drew

• Parliamentarian Riley presented presentation regarding Parli Pro best practices as



well as a brief overview of SGA structure. Riley discussed different motions and points. Point of Information must only be used to request information. If you would like to volunteer information, raise your placard to be added to speaker's list. Point of personal privilege could be used for personal things, such as opening the blinds or leaving the meeting. You can vote yes/aye, no/nay, or abstain (you should give a reason why you're abstaining if possible).

- Q&A regarding Parli Pro:
  - 1. Alex: Anything new in Robert's Rules
    - a. Riley: Not really except formatting
  - 2. Alexis: If you need to use the restroom, should you ask for Point of Personal Privilege or should you leave?
    - Riley: It's generally polite to Point of Personal Privilege or ask for recess
- Q&A regarding SGA Organizations
  - 1. Hannah: Which chairs are vacant?
    - a. Intergovernmental Affairs, Health & Safety, Arts & Performance
- c) Canvas Overview Zea Miller
  - Speaker Zea gave a brief overview of how to use the SGA Canvas page, including how to upload things to Canvas.
- d) UW System
  - Jasmine: Very rough draft presented, entailing that there is a new president for UW
     System. President has put out his 5-yr plan for the UW System. There may be



details missing, I do not have full answers.

- 1. Logan: Point of Personal Privilege Increase document size.
  - a. Jasmine increased document sized and called herself "techy"
- Jasmine did a reading of the UW System Strategic Planning document.
- Jasmine: People in original meeting were confused about how student input should work. They are looking for things to highlight from student's point of view, including direction on how to support faculty and staff.
- Q&A:
  - 1. Hannah: When are they trying to approve this?
    - a. Jasmine: In 2023.
  - 2. James: I agree that there's a lot of vagueness. On page 5, concerned about not supporting artistic or athletic endeavors. Students go to college for a variety of reasons.
    - a. Jasmine: They know that what they want to do is something surrounding economic prosperity, but have not approved certain steps in the nitty-gritty. Will bring support points regarding artistic and athletic development.
  - 3. Hannah: In vision, we aim to be "the best system in the country". Student reps should define what this means.
  - 4. Hannah: Page 5 first goal should be enhance student experience, not advance economic prosperity.
  - 5. Alex: Goals 1-4 are incredibly vague and to have those as the first goal is silly.



I do like how they introduced the Wisconsin Idea.

- Jasmine: Presenter was purposely trying to make it vague and cover multiple points.
- 6. Katie Pg 5, item 12 (sustainability) Working with UW Divestment Coalition and how they have working groups but not one on sustainability. You should probably have a working group for that and working to divest from fossil fuels as a system.
- 7. Riley: I dfon't know what "promote differentiation between universities". I have not heard of such a thing happening. Maybe specialization?
- 8. Zea: it's nice we have these goals, but how do we hold these goals accountable? Also, will students continue to review for accountability?
  - a. Jasmine: In meeting, I asked in what way are they including students on decisions and creation of bigger goals and was given a circle of an answer. This is them trying to get our input. I'm requesting access to the next meeting or a future meeting to input student voices.
- 9. Ryan: Who sees this document and who this influences?
  - Jasmine: This was made by UW System President and Board of
    Regents who allocate most public funds going to universities.
     President has set goals to improve UW System as a whole. We are the
    outsiders seeing this because they're looking for input from a public
    university SGA. This will be used to make goals based on it and the
    goals are supposed to be accessed by Board of Regents who will



allocate money to specific projects to push this agenda.

- 10. Abbi: Maybe helpful to explain Wisconsin Idea and try to tie it into the other pages since you don't really hear anything after that. This might help the goals better.
  - a. Jasmine: The only reason I know why Wisconsin Idea is because it
    was talked about in my DJS class. I will look for education on
    Wisconsin Idea and how it ties into the goals.
- 11. Katie: Everyone is welcome to go to Board of Regents meetings as they are open. I went to one last semester with other students and looking to attend another one in Madison. If anyone wants to join me in December, let me know.
- 12. Brendan: Line about diversity should be more fleshed out with consideration.
  Seems haphazard and pandering.
- 13. Nathan: In terms of accountability, will there be any numbers involved? Any monetary numbers involved?
  - a. Jasmine: No. Board of Regents allocate funds, I'm not sure what they're going to highlight or emphasize. But there is no budget of how to do this as of now, especially due to fluctuations. If information is given, I can send that out.
- 14. Nathan: Does this get proposed to Wisconsin State Legislatures, and if so will UWGB students have any involvement in carrying this out in our school system?



- a. Jasmine: I believe this won't go to legislators other than Regents. But we are the Regents' constituents as part of the UW System as a whole. If we get the fully approved one back and we have comments, we can have a responsibility to reach out as students on what's more important. Regents do also visit here, and if you go to the Board of Regents meetings there are opportunities to speak to the Regents if you feel these goals are not being upheld.
- 15. Logan: Is there a timeframe on how soon they want feedback?
  - a. Jasmine: This is the feedback time. If you have any additional things that you want to bring up between now and 12pm on Monday at the latest, I can upload this on Canvas and people can look into it on their own time.
- 16. Logan: When you present our feedback, how will you do that?
  - Jasmine: JD is taking the minutes. I can copy it, take it to UWGB
     President's Council and email it to them so they have it in written form.
- 17. Grace: I have a personal connection to a Regent and he is happy to come in if anyone has any concerns.

- 18. JD: Strategic plans are generally broad no matter the government. But specificity does help.
