- V. New Business
 - a) Academic Action Plan Delegation
 - Abbie: For those of you who were here when our provost was here, he talked about wanting feedback on the plan. You should have all gotten this in a link with the last agenda. The executives went over this last week quite a bit. I just wanted to go over this, so the senators are also on the same page.
 - 1. What we have done is that we have delegated this into each committee gets a pillar or a portion of a pillar. There are 7 but we scratched the professional growth since students don't have jurisdiction in this. The other 6 were divided up into the committees.
 - Each committee needs to make a document that has constructive criticism, feedback, or comments.
 - 3. I just wanted to bring this to senate for each committee's assignment and when each of these committees are meeting.

- Abbie: At the meeting on the 28th, we are going to be working solely on gathering the feedback to send that to provost Alexander. Make sure you are listening to your executives, so you can give thorough critique.
 - 1. It is not often we are involved in giving feedback for something this big so please, please, please come with feedback.
- Kejuan: So SUFAC doesn't have a committee, can I just go sit on another one?
 - 1. Abbie: Yes, you can go to another meeting. You are more than welcome to offer your feedback in other places.
 - a. Also, when we come back on the 28th, we can get info from the general assembly.
- Montana: I know mine is a lot about different majors and a lot of my senators are
 in the same major so if you have any info about yours, please come talk to me.
- b) Guest Speaker Amy Henniges
 - Handouts
 - Director of Health and Counseling
 - 1. Been meeting with Emily
 - Updates (Counseling):
 - 1. Four licensed professional counselors on our team.
 - 2. Really trying to be more accessible to more students and get more students through the door.



- a. In order to get more students seen quicker we are having a needs assessment. So the counselor can figure out what is needed. In many different sessions, we are going to be recommending the student go to our workshops to learn stress management skills, etc.
- b. Meet three times in a week.
 - i. Once your done, you will meet with a counselor again to see if you still need a treatment plan.
 - ii. If a student moves on to a treatment plan, that is where we are limiting the sessions.
 - 1. 10 per an academic year.
 - 2. If they need more, we will help them find supplemental care in the community.
 - 3. Triage does not count.
 - 4. We are limiting it so more students can get through the door and get help.
 - 5. Initial session, workshop (3 sessions), follow up session: does not count towards the 10
 - a. But it can be decided to go straight to treatment.
- c. So far there has not been a waiting list.
- d. It is FREE to see a counselor.
- Health Side
 - 1. It is free to see a nurse and nurse practitioner.
 - 2. Charge:
 - a. Routine lab work
 - i. Done in clinic or sent out to hospital
 - b. Medication given out
 - i. Keep antibiotics on hand
 - ii. Cough drops, Advil, Tylenol



- 3. Kaitlyn Hendrickson:
 - a. Joined healthy choices task force
 - b. Educator
 - c. Work with sexual assault victims to know their resources
- 4. Administration is looking at outsourcing the health side of our clinic.
 - a. Actively working with an outside clinic to see if that would work better for students.
 - b. If an outside company is selected, our current staff is at risk of not having the same job anymore.
 - c. Decision has not been made yet.
 - i. Please contact Dr. Arneson.
- 5. Kayla: Would prices and location change?
 - Amy: I am not sure but hopefully they add more without making it cost more for students.
- 6. Abbie: We are going to restructure speakers list. If you have multiple questions, mention it so we can give them a second.
- 7. Q&A:
 - a. Kejuan: If an outside company came in, would they lower the prices?
 - i. I don't know the answer to that. I have not been privy to the vendor response. I hope it doesn't cost more.
 - b. Addison: On the lab services and medication, does this campus have connection with specific hospitals?
 - i. Right now, our clinic has a medical director from prevea, our labs go to Bellin, a psychiatrist, women's health's from aurora.
 - ii. If one vendor comes in, it might be more exclusive.
 - c. JD: With the triage services, do these counts towards the 10?
 - i. No, they don't count.
 - d. Abbie: More about triage



- i. `Everyday we keep two appt open for the more urgent situations. Any students that communicates they want to see a counselor, they ask if it is urgent and try to streamline them into a triage appt. But every day a counselor needs to be flexible.
- e. Joy: If you had questions to change things about the center, where do we talk about that?
 - i. I would love to hear about it. Please call me, make an appt
 - ii. Abbie: Or Emily
- f. Kejuan: yield

- h. Kayla: If you have concerns with the new vendor, who should we talk to?

 - i. We are going to count the ten for academic year and use summer as a separate scenario
- j. Sarah: Do we know the possible vendor?
 - i. We would have to ask Dr. Arneson if that information can be shared.
 - ii. Abbie: It has been a long process so reach out to Dr Arneson
- k. Jake: Able to meet with psychiatrist here instead of going to aurora?
 - i. Dependent on student situation. Usually the referrals come through a counselor.
 - ii. We are really limiting it to students who can't get access to a psychiatrist in the community.
 - iii. She only comes one day a month
- Amy: Our nurse practitioner has become very busy with serving students with anxiety and depression needs



- i. Also, flu shots. \$20 each for students which is basically cost.

- n. Addison: how do we get victims actually in to get the help they need?
 - i. We are able to get them in because of our outreach. We get them connected with services, so they can get support.
 - ii. Our campus like every other campus, still doesn't have the correct amount of reports coming forward that are equal in real life.
 - iii. The stats don't really line up with our student population.
 - 1. It is still under-reported.
 - 2. We need more people feeling safe and comfortable.
- o. Mohomed: Most patients dealing with anxiety and depression, how are you using those 10?
 - Working one on one with the counselor to learn self-help strategies. Our counselors feel like ten sessions can help with that.
 - ii. For how many people came, the average time was 4.7 times.
 - 1. There was a very small amount of people who came more than ten times
- p. Abbie: Our counseling on campus, is often used as a temporary service they are trying to bridge you into different resources.

 - a. "I move"
 - 2. Motion is seconded
 - a. Motion must be seconded
 - b. Yes, this is a good idea
 - 3. Chair states the question
 - a. Second does not necessarily indicate agreement
 - b. That is G
 - Rephrase if needed
 - 4. Debate
 - a. Majority Vote (more than 50%)

- Language:
 - 1. Quorum: minimum number of people needed to do business
 - a. Half plus 1
 - 2. Motion: proposed idea on which to be discussed and voted
 - 3. Second: to support discussion of a motion
 - 4. Amend: Make changes to a motion
 - 5. Majority: 50%
 - 6. Abstain: refrain from voting
 - a. Only abstain if you have something to gain
 - b. Ex: president of an organization about to get funding from SUFAC
 - 7. Adjourn: to close the meeting

 - ii. Literally voting on when to vote
 - 1. If it passes, then you can vote on the motion
 - iii. Very important to state what you are voting on!!!
- Add an amendment
 - 1. Amend a motion during any pint of discussion
 - 2. After an amendment is moved and seconded...
 - a. Discuss only the amendment not original motion
 - b. Vote on amendment
 - c. Discuss the motion (as amended or not)
 - d. Vote on the motion (as amend or not)
 - e. Friendly amendments are efficient
 - i. Don't have to vote
 - 3. Make one decision at a time
