The discontinuation of the theater major would cast significant doubt on our commitment to the fine arts, such as our partnership with the Weidner Center. Therefore, the Student Government Association opposes the University's proposal to remove the majors related to Theater and minors related to sciences. Therefore, be it resolved that Student Government Association implores the administration to reconsider other avenues for cutting university funds that would not jeopardize our fine arts programs.
