- I really wanted to acknowledge your significant effort. We enjoy teaching students, we enjoy interacting with students. To be honest with you, it is much more fun for



me to teach face to face. It is just thrilling for me, just to imagine that we are able to do what we're doing at this point in the semester.

- b) Dr. King: I just wanted to further the conversation. If there are no immediate questions, if people want to respond. How are classes going for you? General comments just so we can get a sense also about what Dr. Merkel mentioned as well.
- c) Questions:
 - G: A common theme and something we have talked about at the past few meetings is just the struggles that students are facing this semester. It is mainly through professors and course loads. Sometimes it is not understanding a course sometimes it is not having the right tools for a course. For a few people you have to self teach and there is a lot more content that comes with that and online interactions and the way we substitute class interactions. It creates a very different educational experience. IT is a very common feed we have seen with student feedback.
 - 1. Dr. Merkel: I certainly appreciate that. For whatever it is worth, it kind of gets into an empathy piece and our chancellor talks quite a bit about this. I think too, if this helps you, it can be really tough on the faculty as well. I think it is important to say to all of you that you are not alone int hat. That may give you some sense that maybe faculty are even more accessible than you realize to reach out to them. I really absolutely believe that and I know I



have experienced that too. To whatever extent we can help, reach out. To the faculty, students services, tutoring services are great resources too.

- 2. Something that applies across the campus but we talk about in human bio a lot, we talk about road maps to get you to where you wanna be. As a first generation student, I was really ignorant of all of that when I was in your shoes. What are office hours? Can I go to faculty during their office hours. Absolutely know, that you can and you should reach out. I cant emphasize that enough. Although it has been many many years since I was a college student, those experiences factor into how I teach. It is empathy again. I realize how difficult that can be and how challenging that can be. Sometimes the best thing I can do is let you know that you are not alone and the campus community understand that.
- 3. One of the great things about this campus is that we are constantly amazed by all of the things you do. I think it is an important focus for us. If there are any questions related to that, certainly let me know.
- Montana: A comment about the semester, I think it has been hard socially. We would spend hours in the office together just talking and you're not getting those interactions to fill your bucket. It has just been really awkward socially and trying to figure out how to see people or talk to people you don't have a close relationship with but its not necessarily a close relationship with everybody. Social dynamics have been hard this semester and in general.



- 1. Dr. Merkel: My wife recently just left the house to drive to east town mall because she couldn't take being in the house any longer. She needed some type of interaction. I really do think there is something to this. This is not natural to how we normally engage each other and how we carry out our lives. My wife is a high school teacher. I certainly understand that it is really important to have an outlet.
- 2. One of the things that is really important too, this past spring when we closed down, all of you know that we sort of in place of the typical course evaluation, there was an opportunity for different type of feedback for faculty. As I was going through my performance review report, we incorporate all the feedback from students into that as well, I thought it was so helpful and I wasn't entirely sure at the beginning, this spring when I heard that things are going to change, I thought it was incredibly helpful because of the reason and the points of this conversation right here.
- 3. One of the great things the students talked about is the unique challenges you faced and continue to face in this environment. There can be some depression, the lack of social interaction, this whole empathy thing came up. When we talk about how we interact with students and how we reflect upon and how in light of that information we should think about our courses as teachers. The kinds of things we need to take into consideration. Everybody is unique especially during this time. Keep doing that. Keep sharing these feelings you have with others. Reach out if you need help.



- Mohomed: We are really doing well compared to others schools, compared to the number of cases. My question is, despite what's going on besides our school, what are some of the things we can hope for so we can think about that instead?
 - 1. Dr. Merkel: I can't tell you how much I appreciate that. You're question is going to help me release my science geekiness. You asked for some sign of hope. Given what we know about the virus and what we know about vaccines is that we have some reason to be hopeful that this time next year, hopefully before next semester starts, that things will look more similar to what we remember.
 - 2. There are some signs that we really could have a vaccine. The other thing that we do have to keep an eye on is, I think that sometimes the greatest impact for the people that are not behaving and not doing what we need to do, comes from all of you.
 - 3. As an example of this, we have pre-med students who work in hospitals and in these hospitals, they are bearing witness to the challenge that hospital workers are going through. That message needs to get out to a larger audience. What is particularly powerful about the students in these hospitals, is that they are also campus community members and they know the kind of things that are working to have this good effect and good outcome, so I really hope there are more chances and opportunities for you to speak. It is a sign of hope.



- 4. I really do think that with everything happening and the progress with vaccines is there is reason to be hopeful for what is to come in Fall of 2021
- Montana: I know a lot of school shave been talking about not having a spring break. Is that something we have discussed at this point?
 - Dr. Merkel: Thinking right now is that spring break will occur as it always has
 in the past. The spring schedule looks as though it will not change at this
 point in time.
- Addison: As the son of a doctor I agree with what is being said.
 - 1. Dr. Merkel: I think we have a really good opportunity through this community, it is really unfortunate that there is a lot of misinformation being conveyed on how to keep each other safe and get back to the lives we used to know. In thinking about that, as I read the note Addison wrote.
 - To that I would say to all of you, if you have any questions about any of this, it really comes down to identifying and finding accurate and valid information.
 - 3. Some of the things you can do, you can share what you are learning with your family members. You can talk about the good the bad and the ugly of the internet as a source for information. You can talk about how well this campus is doing and discuss why the campus is doing so well.
 - 4. My whole thing really comes down to this: we where seatbelts. Why do we wear seatbelts and obey speed laws? We do this because car accidents can be devastating for family but they are also a tremendous negative for the



economy. The same goes for disease. It is very unfortunate that face masks have become political. They work, end of story.

- 5. The three W's. watch your distance, wear a mask, wash your hands and stay at home if you are ill. The more we all do that, there's an empowering message here, if it is true that everyone wants to get back to what we used to know, ion some respects it couldn't be simpler. The challenging part is compliance and getting people that don't want to listen and don't want to be accountable. That is where it gets difficult.
- 6. I have no interest other than public health to say what I am saying. If you know someone who would be interested in having a conversation about the science that I know and have been involved in. We want hospitals to be able to take care of people, they are completely overwhelmed with COVID patients. We have a field hospital. That is something that I have only seen in history books. And now because of COVID 19 and because we are not doing what we should be doing, we have one because the hospitals in the area are being challenged. There are plans for a field hospital in Madison.
