- a) Daniela Beall, University Sustainability Coordinator
 - Daniela Beall (she/they) spoke about the Office of Sustainability on campus. Does anyone know about sustainability on campus?
 - Riley: SUFAC knows about composting and the funding side of things
 - Jasmine: Your position is focused on creating activities and future ideas to leave
 less of a carbon footprint and leave a better environment for the future
 - Daniela: My position is involving sustainability in the curriculum, campus life, operations, biodiversity, etc. Sustainability for me is preserving earth for future generations; about wellbeing and social and ecological dimensions. My job is really interesting, I collab with a lot of people. I love working with people, look forward to any ideas you have and opportunities to collaborate. A couple things:
 - Composting: GPS program last year did a pilot, composting intern, buckets
 paid for by SGA, hoping to expand this program to offices, working with
 Chartwells implementing composting on campus
 - 2. Having conversations about EV charging stations, still working through the process of getting quotes



- 3. Going to be working with facilities on drafting the Climate Action Plan; we want to write a two-year plan to get us to the five-year plan in 2025 with identified projects for a ten-year plan
- 4. I have 15 interns working on a variety of projects, some are at the branch campuses
- 5. Want to have stakeholder meetings and student meetings to talk about what we want UWGB to look like in the future as the Eco-U
