- V. Guest Speaker
 - a) Matt Suwalski-University Union Director



- The entire report we have is 512 pages long. We are not talking about in a year were a talking about years for this redesign. We will continue to update this group and we will come forward with a final project to get the referendums.
- We requested a union pre-design in October of 2019. We hired contractors to look
 at the union. June of 2021 to October 2021 is when the work happened. Smaller
 groups got together to gather information. The groups did a survey and then a
 draft was issued in October of 2021 and that gave us this pre-design.
- Future timeline
 - 1. Fall of 2023 or spring 2024 to have a student referendum.
 - 2. Enumeration
 - 3. Phase one: 2028-2029
 - 4. Phase two
- We have our main dining facility located within the union. If we do something to that we have nowhere to feed our students. This is a big factor of the union rebuild.
- Project drivers
 - Entry point to campus for our students. We don't want to be the main entry
 point. Recognize that this isn't the main entry. Feedback was that people
 don't know this is the union and the entrance to the union.
 - 2. This building is a focus of student life on campus and the layout is unwelcoming.



- There are code compliance issues. We have to go to the city and state to build things.
- 4. The final project will implement sustainability.

Renovation priorities

- Meet the changing need of our diverse population. What students wanted in the past years is not what people want now. We only get one more renovation.
- 2. Increase bathrooms and increase gender neutral bathrooms.
- 3. Move several of our student services to the main level of the union. Have interaction and make it easy.
- 4. Increase the size of the university ball room.
- Address existing code compliance. We have a loading dock that is difficult to use.
- Reasons why students come to the union.
 - 1. To eat and drink.
- Barriers to coming to the union
 - 1. No convenient parking. We need to redefine convenient
- There was envisioning. Student could select images that they like and concepts that they like.
- We are slightly below the FTE average. Purple on the photo was so big because that is the primary food service.



- FTE is full time equivalent. Full time and part time added up and divided up gives us a common number.
- Past timeline renovations
 - 1. 1975: main building was built.
 - 2. 1984
 - 3. 1994
 - 4. 2006: Bookstore, marketplace, credit union
- Pictures were shown to envision how union was being built.
 - 1. Divide building in half and renovate one half at a time. Operation would have to change while renovations were being done.
- We are rebuilding the library and from that we will have a way to interact with the back of the union better.
- Questions
 - 1. The estimated cost as designed for option 1 was north of 153 million dollars. There is a second option which we will most likely pursue with the same square footage in a two-phase approach. We are a primary food service location and we have had a few renovations before and are tied to tunnels and those are things we have to handle.
 - 2. Harrison: does the \$153 include inflation or is that what it would be right now.
 - a. Yes that is a challenge that we may have to deal with. We are not anticipating construction to start until 2027. The lower amount is \$76



million which is the plan we are looking at right now. The original budget we worked on was 60 million.

- 3. Harrison: Is that money is coming out of the seg fees?
 - a. We will have to discuss that and see how to adjust the seg fee if that is what you want to do. We are looking at adding \$300 a year and it will have to be adjusted for the final project?
- 4. What about grants and fundraising
 - a. There may be opportunities and I don't think we will get a name sponsor, but we will look.
- 5. Riley: I saw org storage was put where the SGA suites were, I know right now it is impossible for new orgs to find a place for their stuff will that be accounted
 - a. Yes.
- This is a long process and there are alternatives. There is a lot of things to consider
 with current market, inflation, and what students want. We will continue to modify
 this space to make it what students want.
- b) Paul Pinkston-Director of Facilities, Management, and Planning
 - Talk about snow plowing and snow removal. What we have is our day-to-day side, residential, events, and weekend residential. We have policies that have been replaced that we teak based on conditions. We have limited number of staff. Long term we are strategizing with university police and RHAA about what is or is not



working. We look at sustainability efforts like salting. We have new and better equipment.

Plowing

- Day to day: University Police would call if there was 3 inches and we would start plowing.
- 2. The weekend we have a certain plowing run for the sidewalks. When it comes to snow removal. There is a lot that goes into plowing we have a lot of sidewalks and roads and parking, and it is all spread out. We have events and commuter students that impact these things.
- We found that there is a program called salt wise with a training program and all
 grounds staff went. You have to be licensed to throw salt down. You can find out
 how bad salt really is. It can impact water systems.
 - 1. After the winter 325 tons of salt 150 tons salt sand was used.
 - 2. January of 20 we implanted different practices. 66 tons of salt this past winter. If the ground is below 15 the salt will not melt.
 - 3. We did smarter salting and changes to our equipment.
 - 4. Traded equipment we didn't use. I have a machine for residential areas just for sidewalks. The plowing here can be a challenge due to space and staffing. We have an order of which we plow. Certain parking lots before others
- Changes to make now:
 - 1. Bring back moving cars after a snowfall to plow easier.



- 2. There will be times where it will be slippery. We try to do our best and like to have positive feedback. There is a lot of area, and some might be missed so please just let us know positively. We are continuously trying to improve and find a better way.
- 3. The main focus is that we want to get people form the parking lot into the first building so that is what is plowed first. Form there we end up moving out.
- 4. We limit out salt use based on the temperature and then go back and peel off the salt. Once it gets to a certain temperature it refreezes.
- Cassandra: with the new equipment is there a number of additional staff members that would make this easier
 - We are looking for students it was put out on handshake. We hired a parttime employee.
- Main points: Less salt usage, new equipment,
- Questions
 - 1. Cassandra: Have you looked into other alternatives like brine?
 - a. Used to do brine but problem is that depending on the situation we may not get there in time for the brine to work. Reducing the brine usage made our roads better. We don't have the capability to be here 24/7 but based on that we exceed that the best we can. Our salt trucks have sensors and stops spitting salt when the temperatures are too high.



- 2. Ted: You limited staff, is that due to budget or
 - a. That is the same number of staff before. People's expectations have just changed. So, it is not that if we get more staff it will be better. Sometimes it doesn't make sense to add more staff but using our tools to make things more effective.
- 3. Alex: You talked about the hosing parking lots and moving cars. Do you have any concrete plans?
 - a. In the past we used to put out huge flags which was a single that said this parking lot is closed have our car out at this time. With this new equipment it shouldn't take too long. You will get advanced notice and cues but looking at past years and not doing it has been more detrimental to roads and students. This will make things easier and getting out of the parking lot. We will work with res life and parking. We are trying to figure out what notification would be most visible. There is a fine if you don't move your car. It just makes it easier to plow. They didn't do it last year.
- 4. Abbi: if we have to move our cars, where would we park them.
 - a. Different parking lots or side of the street that is already plowed. We have so much parking that there is plenty of spots.
 - b. It is a much better result if there are no cars.

- c) Statewide Student Governance Resolution-First Reading

 - Yes and no, the goal is to pass the same document beside switch out names pertaining to our campus and location.
- Harrison: what we might do is add names to persons relevant on our campus, so they see the Stevens point has passed this but also Green Bay has passed it.
