This Articulation Agreement ("Agreement") dated 5/1/2024 between The Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System, d.b.a. the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay ("UW-Green Bay"), and the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) supersedes all prior agreements for the Program named below.

#### Introduction and Rationale:

In accordance with the University of Wisconsin System guidelines for articulation agreements between UW System Institutions and WTCS (Wisconsin Technical College System) Districts, this Agreement will allow required coursework taken in the Foundations of Teacher Education Program at WTCS institutions to transfer and satisfy requirements within the Bachelor of Science in Education, Elementary and Middle School K-9 emphasis at UW-Green Bay.

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide a seamless transfer process for students from WTCS institutions who desire further education to enter UW-Green Bay.

#### **Conditions:**

The terms of this Articulation Agreement apply only to WTCS students who successfully complete the Foundations of Teacher Education Program, meet the admission requirements for UW-Green Bay, and have applied and been accepted to the UW-Green Bay Professional Program in Education.

Further, the terms included in this agreement apply to students that started the Foundations of Education program at a WTCS institution beginning in or after August 2021, following the most recent revision to the statewide WTCS Foundations of Education curriculum.

Students are required to successfully complete all UW-Green Bay degree requirements to earn a UW-Green Bay degree. Successful completion of this bachelor degree program, along with other Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) requirements such as student teaching and extremal assessments, is intended to lead to teacher certification with the at for grades Kindergarten through grade nine. Students will be advised of all requirements upon acceptance to the program.

DPI requirements change from time-to-time, making program requirements subject to change. Students must meet any new requirements before a license will be awarded.

## **Articulated Courses:**

Students who successfully complete the Foundations of Teacher Education (FoTE) Program at a WTCS institution and meet the admission requirements of the UW-Green Bay Education program will transfer 60 credits\* towards a Bachelor of Science Degree with an Education Major, which may lead to endorsement for a Wisconsin Teaching License. Courses will be assigned by course-to-course and/or block equivalency as listed in the tables below.

#### ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS AND PROVISIONS

- 1. Courses must be recorded on an official transcript for students to receive credits from the Agreement.
- 2. Each institution has the right and responsibility to make changes to its curricula and enrollment standards to maintain its academic integrity and meet accreditation standards. Such changes, if any, will be communicated to the other institution as they occur through the office of each institution responsible for implementing this Agreement.
- 3. To receive the credit transfer set forth within this Articulation Agreement, the candidate must have received an associate degree through the WTCS Foundations of Teacher Education program.
- 4. UW-Green Bay and WTCS will provide academic advising to WTCS students inquiring about UW-Green Bay programs. UW-Green Bay and WTCS will share materials, catalogs, and other information to facilitate their understanding of requirements and programs. WTCS institution will assist UW-Green Bay in arranging recruitment events on its campuses.
- 5. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach its student population. Both parties will adhere to each institution's standards for the use of its name and logo. Each institution may provide a link to this Agreement and/or the other institution at its website, with notice to the other party.
- 6. Both parties agree that failure to maintain regional accreditation will be grounds for termination of the Agreement.
- 7. This Articulation Agreement is effective 02/01/2024 and will be reviewed every 2 years, after any changes to the Undergraduate Catalog at UW-Green Bay have been approved. Both WTCS and UW-Green Bay agree to notify each other of any curricular changes in a timely manner.
- 8. This Agreement may be terminated by either institution by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the designee at the other institution at the address set forth above. If the Agreement is terminated, students at UW-Green Bay who have obtained the WTCS Foundations of Education Associate Degree shall be allowed to complete their programs under the terms of the Agreement.
